Ms. Jayashree Watal is currently Honorary Professor at the National Law University, Delhi (since 2019), Adjunct Professor at Georgetown University Law Centre (since 2009), and part time consultant on trade-related intellectual property rights. She is a member of the Governance Board of the Medicines Patent Pool, a non-profit organization based in Geneva (since 2015). She was Counsellor in the Intellectual Property, Government Procurement and Competition Division of the World Trade Organization from February 2001 to July 2019.

Ms. Watal holds post-graduate degrees in both law and economics and, prior to joining the WTO, has had more than twenty two years of experience in government in India. She represented India at a crucial stage in the Uruguay Round TRIPS negotiations from 1989-90.

She is the co-editor of two WTO books: A Handbook on the TRIPS Agreement, (Cambridge University Press, 2012) and of The Making of the TRIPS Agreement, (WTO, 2015). She has authored a book Intellectual Property Rights in the WTO and Developing Countries (Oxford University Press, India and Kluwer Law International, 2001) and several peer-reviewed journal articles on issues related to the law/economics of intellectual property rights.

She was a Visiting Scholar at the Center for International Development at Harvard University (2000); the Peterson Institute for International Economics, Washington DC (Oct. 1998-August 2000); and at the George Washington University Law School, Washington, D.C. (1997-2000). She has also taught courses on intellectual property at the University of Barcelona's International Economic Law and Policy (IELPO) programme, Graduate Institute, Geneva, the World Trade Institute, Berne, and at University of Melbourne Law School.
